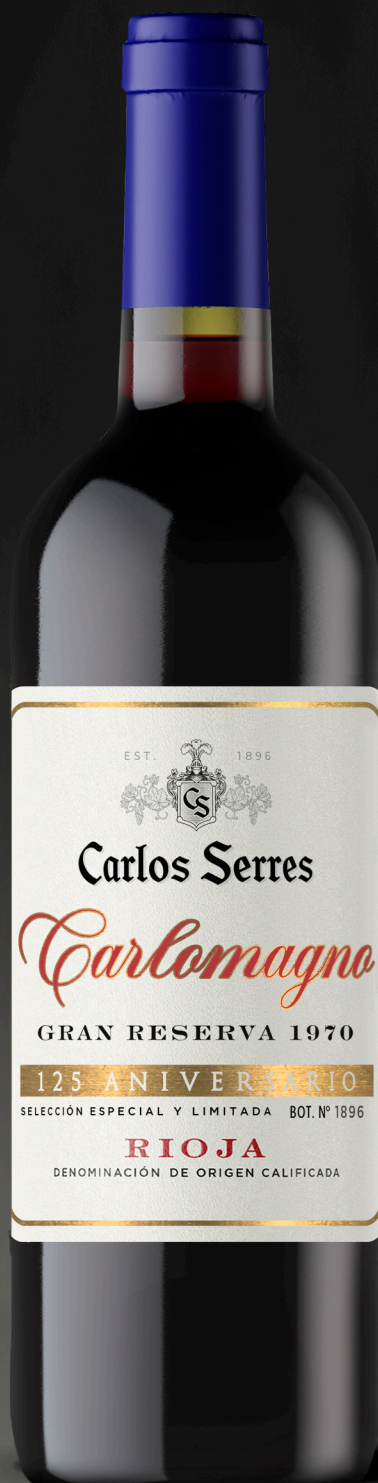

THE REVIVAL OF A CLASSIC

The last vintage that Bodegas Carlos Serres bottled of its flagship Carlomagno label was in the late 1970s. After more than 40 years in the market, the winery sold the brand as part of a refocus of its winemaking and commercial policy.

If Carlos Serres Gran Reserva exuded power, the more bordeaux style, Carlomagno showed finesse and elegance, in a more burgundian line.

While carrying out a winery inventory, we discovered an unlabelled batch of bottles that had been earmarked as Carlomagno.

After years of work, we managed to recover the Carlomagno brand as the historic label of Bodegas Carlos Serres. Coinciding with the 125th Anniversary of the establishment of the winery, we have relaunched the brand in a special edition of 1896 bottles (a number that coincided with the year the winery opened).

HARVEST DETAILS

It was a shorter vintage compared to previous years, with lower production, mainly due to scant rainfall and significantly higher average temperatures, resulting in greater concentration.

Weather-wise, it was a warm and dry growing cycle for that period, with an average temperature of 12.4°C and a total rainfall of 354 L/M².
